# **Important Presentation for Parents- Safer Space: Wednesday Jan. 31st 7 p.m. in the library**

Safer Space for Adults is a 60-minute interactive workshop designed to help parents, care givers, and service providers to better understand how to help children stay safe online.

# "Pawsitive" Practices

As part of our school Focus this year we will be explicitly teaching some "Pawsitive Practices" to encourage friendly, kind behaviour that builds our sense of community and belonging. Jan. 22- Feb.2nd our focus will be on

# "Allowing others to go before you."

Here are some examples of how to do this at school, home or out in the community. As always, any learning initiative will be more successful when modelled and supported at home. Thank you for encouraging your children to engage in these "Pawsi-

tivie Practise". If you have further ideas or examples, please feel free to share them with Mrs. Hoffinger!

- When lining up to go outside or come inside, allow someone to take the spot in front of you, or offer to be at the back
- Open and hold the door for another
- When walking in the hallway or on a sidewalk move to the side, so that others may pass
- Encourage others to put their hand up
- Let someone ahead of you in line at a store
- Wait, so that someone else gets the first piece of pizza
- Offer to help someone with their learning assignment if you finished early
- Anticipate someone else's need, like bringing a classmate their jacket, or leaving the sharp pencil for the next person
- Leave the last cookie for someone else
- When playing a game, try letting others go first if that is new to you
- In basketball, look to pass the ball to an open team mate so that they have the opportunity to score
- -in choir, encourage someone else to try a solo
- If you are always first on the swing or slide, let someone go before you

Start asking your kids 'who did you help today?' instead of asking 'how was school?'.

They'll start their stories with 'I held the door', 'helped a friend with math', or 'asked someone to sit with us at lunch'.

Reconciliation, Equity, Diversity and Inclusion with Richmond School District

A webinar series on Zoom for parents and caregivers to understand and support SD38 initiatives around inclusion and belonging.

This initial 60-minute session is designed to help you understand the district's commitment to reconciliation, equity, diversity and inclusion, and the values and language that inform our practices in schools.
