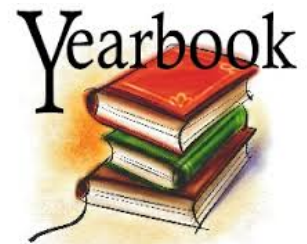
We have enjoyed having you in the school and we wish you the best of luck in your careers.

### Items at School

### Sun Safety



With warm, sunny weather just around the corner, it is important to be reminded of the importance of sun safety. Here are a few tips from Health Canada.

- \* Plan to be outside in the early morning or late afternoon.
- \* Stay in the shade and out of the hot sun between 11 a.m. and 4 p.m.
- \* If you are in the sun between 11 a.m. and 4 p.m., wear long pants, long sleeves and a hat with a wide brim to protect your skin from sunburn.

\* Wear sunglasses that provide UVA and UVB protection.

\* Use a sunscreen lotion or cream that is Sun Protection Factor (SPF) 15 or more.

\* Use a sunscreen that says "broad-spectrum" on the label. It will screen out most of the UVA and UVB rays.

\* Put sunscreen on your skin 20 minutes before you go out and reapply 20 minutes after being out in the sun to ensure even application of the product and better protection.

\* Don't forget your lips, ears and nose. These parts of your body burn easily.

\* Sunscreen gets washed off by water and sweat. So, put more sunscreen on after you go swimming or if you are sweating.

## Class Organization Process for 2017-2018

In the process of determining class placements, there is a number of **student and school organizational considerations** involved that we consider prior to making a placement decision. As experienced, professional educators we are sensitive to the needs of each student and review these factors in an educationally sound manner to ensure the best placement possible for our students within existing school operational resources and constraints.

**Student considerations** in determining placement include:

- Learning styles and strengths
- Age and physical maturity
- Past academic performance and term goals
- Special learning needs
- Degree of independence in work habits
- Previous year's placement including history of placement in the upper or lower grades of a combined class
- Social and personal characteristics (friendships)
- Educational and personal information received from parents about the child

**School organizational considerations** include:

- Creating heterogeneous (mixed ability) rather than homogeneous class groupings
- Creating a balanced academic and social/emotional educational classroom setting
- Equitable class size and composition assignments as defined by contract

The process for creating class groupings is as follows:

**Step 1: Gathering information.** During the early part of June, staff will collect and condense information for each student with respect to the student considerations listed above.

Often parents are able to provide their child's teacher with new information about their child not previously shared. This may include written information about the qualities of the learning environment they feel their child needs for next year. A format for that written input is included below. We would ask that this information NOT include comments about/requests for specific teachers.

**Please note that I will be sharing all information received from parents with staff as we conduct our discussions around placement decisions. All information will be shared; there will be no private and confidential information with respect to class placement.**

**Accordingly, I will be discouraging any private meetings with the administration around placement matters, partly for that reason but also because it is simply not manageable for the principal to meet with every parent about a child's placement for next year. That is a dialogue that is best conducted, if necessary, in a respectful manner between the parents and the child's teacher - both of whom should know the child far better than the principal.**

**Step 2: Meeting together in grade groupings with the administration.** In late June, we will combine the information received from parents along with our knowledge of the children in a school setting to make the best placements we can with the resources provided and the constraints that exist within our system. The goal will be to create heterogeneous, cohesive groups of learners for a positive learning environment.

**Step 3: Reviewing and adjusting.** At the end of June and during the first few days at school in September, the child's present and future teacher, along with the principal, will review the class composition to account for children who may have moved or who may have registered late and been placed in the school by the district's student placement officer. Please feel free to contact Mr. Cherry if you have any questions or suggestions regarding this process. Please feel free to complete the form below with the information you feel may be important for your child's teacher to know in helping to determine class placement for next year. **Return it to Mrs. Fung in the office by June 9, 2017.** If you feel it necessary to communicate more information than the form allows, then please feel free to contact your child's teacher during the next two weeks with that information.
